 attend an opportunity prior to completing their first year in 4-H may not receive more
 than a 50% award. The amount may be adjusted by the Clermont County 4-H
 Committee as needed.

In a positive and supportive atmosphere, participants are encouraged and empowered to experiment with new activities, develop new abilities, discover new interests, expand their creativity, practice and master new leadership skills, share ideas and personal skills, establish new friendships, and develop networks of human resources. Ashley, Ohio. (March 29 - April 2, 2017) (Cost to member will be approximately \$53).
		Carving New Ideas (8 th -12 th grade) Carving New Ideas is a camping opportunity for older youth, concentrating on the principles of critical thinking and program facilitation. Campers will explore hands-on workshops that encourage ideation in important areas of 4-H programming, including health, agriscience, and STEM. Participants will develop action plans to address issues within their communities using a critical thinking model for team situations. Columbus, Ohio. (November 2017) (Cost to member will be approximately \$10).
		Citizenship Washington Focus (ages 14-19) Teens will learn about government, national events, national landmarks, citizenship and personal responsibility. Participants will stay at the National 4-H Center in Washington, D.C. (July 2-8, 2017) (Cost to member will be approximately \$180, based on 2016 registration costs).
		<u>Jr. Shooting Sports Education Camp</u> (ages 9-12) Youth will participate in a wide variety of training opportunities with hands-on instruction and experience. Canter's Cave. (June 30-July 2, 2017)(Cost to member will be approximately \$33).
		<u>Leadership Washington Focus</u> (7 th -9 th grade) Teens will learn about leadership, national events, national landmarks, integrity and personal responsibility.
